The Complete Works of St. Teresa of Avila & St. John of the Cross

The Carmelite Digital Library (CDL) is a digital collection of all the works of St. John of the Cross and all the works of St. Teresa of Avila in two English translations and in Spanish. The CDL offers a rich full-featured set of tools for reading, studying, and researching the works of these two great Carmelite Doctors of the Church. *This is not an audio product*.

To install the Carmelite Digital Library: Digital Download for macOS

- 1. Download the file onto your computer.
- 2. If you have version 2.0 of the CDL installed, uninstall it before continuing.
- 3. Double click on the file "CDL_StTeresa_StJohn2.1.dmg".
- 4. Accept the Carmelite Digital Library license.
- 5. In the resulting window, drag the "Carmelite Digital Library.app" icon on top of the "Applications" folder.
- 6. The program is now installed in your Applications folder.
- 7. Due to the fact that the CDL is not registered program with Apple, you will get a warning dialog when trying to launch the program about not allowing apps from an unidentified developer to execute. To run the program, you will need to override the security settings¹:
 - In the Finder I on your Mac, locate the Carmelite Digital Library app.
 Don't use Launchpad to do this. Launchpad doesn't allow you to access the shortcut menu.
 - Control-click the app icon, then choose Open from the shortcut menu.
 - Click Open.

The app is saved as an exception to your security settings, and you can open it in the future by double-clicking it just as you can any registered app.²

- 2. Open "Security & Privacy".
- 3. Select the lock at the bottom of the screen to allow editing of settings.
- 4. Type your admin password if prompted.
- 5. In the "Allow apps downloaded from:" area, remember the current setting
- 6. Now select "Open Anyway"
- 7. Run the CDL and exit
- 8. In the "Allow apps downloaded from:" area, select the previous value for the setting to reset
